From the Executive Director

Dear colleagues and friends,

This week I have been very pleased with the news from Cathedral Music Trust that they are working on an expression of interest to UNESCO with regards the designation of English Sacred Choral Music as an intangible heritage. Many of you and in particular your Directors of Music will have been part of the consultation process back in October. CMT will continue to share details of the progress of their application and will be launching a public campaign for support. The short description is as follows: "English Sacred Choral Music is a living practice of collective music-making characterised by a distinctive choral sound and a rich body of repertoire. Originating in English cathedral and collegiate foundations, it has become a defining element of cultural life in the UK, expressed through cross-denominational liturgical services and secular performances."

We are working with Rev Julia Porter-Pryce who is supporting us on a voluntary basis to extend our research into the area of **Art Exhibitions in Cathedrals**. She is undertaking some qualitative research with a number of cathedrals, and we hope to produce a concise document to share with all our members to support with some of the practicalities of hosting an exhibition: funding, engagement plan, installation, logistics, evaluation. If you are interested in knowing more, or having a conversation with Julia, please contact me directly and I will put you in touch.

Julia will be joining us at the conference in May, alongside David Olusoga, Eve Poole, and Canon Leslie Francis as we explore the cultural impact of our cathedrals. Information on booking and bursaries below.
